HIV/AIDS-Related Cancer – People with HIV/AIDS have an increased risk of developing certain cancers, including Kaposi sarcoma and non-Hodgkin's



lymphoma. This is likely linked to their weakened immune systems. The first <u>World AIDS Day</u> was in 1988, created to raise awareness and remember all those who have suffered with this disease.
