

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## **CIA**: Chemotherapy-induced alopecia

Many people suffer CIA, hair loss due to chemotherapy, and are unsure about where to turn for support and/or advice about wigs (in medical terms, "cranial/hair prosthesis"). While Medicare Parts A and B do not cover the wig costs, some private insurance policies do with medical Rx.

ACS has helpful info, including tips about wigs as well as coping strategies. LLS also has a listing of helpful resources. Lena Fleminger (443-519-2574), whose own mother dealt with medical hair loss, offers non-judgmental advice and guidance as well as customized wigs and follow up support for women of all ethnicities and hair preferences. Image Recovery (410-502-5623) is located in some hospitals and provides consults by appointment.

## November 1, 2024 - January 15, 2025 **Maryland Health Connection**

Private health plans and Maryland Medical Assistance for 2025. Click to browse plans and get an estimate of cost. Nine out of 10 people who enroll are eligible for financial help to pay for the plan.

All plans available through the Maryland Health Connection cover important health benefits - doctor visits, prescriptions, mental health services, and more.
