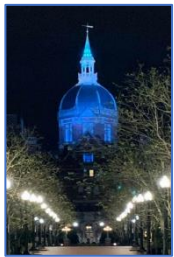

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HELPLINE for Weight Loss is a fully remote Johns Hopkins research study (IRB00403808) for overweight cancer survivors who have completed treatment and are Maryland residents at least 18 yo with MCI>27: Using emails, text messages, phone calls, and free smartphone app to provide behavioral weight loss materials, weight loss reminders, and optional telephone coaching, with no medications or special foods involved. Eligible participants will receive a free digital scale and agree to provide their weights at 5 specific times over 12 months.
